## Tarpley VFD's Awarded \$45K Grant from LCRA/BEC

Last fall, shortly before the annual picnic fundraiser the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) through the Bandera Electric Cooperative (BEC) announced that funds were available for non-profit organizations to be solely used for improving infrastructure. In the Tarpley VFD five-year plan, an area of need addressed was increasing the size of the pavilion and replacing the roofs over the areas used during the picnic. The TVFD board discussed this need, however the board felt that our patrons' donations should be used for fire fighting and training needs. The board agreed that refurbishing the "picnic buildings" should be done primarily with grant funds. A group of members began compiling data for the grant and submitted it to the LCRA September 1, 2014. The competitive applications for the

grant were from the entire LCRA service area which extends from Brownwood to Goliad and Rocksprings to Brenham. On December 8, the TVFD received notice that it had been awarded a \$45,253 grant.

With this grant the department has increased the size of the pavilion by nearly 50 percent, put new roofs over the dessert/tea booths and serving area, bought a new refrigerator-cooler and installed a 40 foot stainless steel countertop in the bar-b-que area. The department was responsible for a 20% percent match. The board felt this was a good return on investment since these facilities serve as the primary resources for our annual fundraiser and as a resource to the Tarpley community.

From the Chief... The effectiveness of a volunteer fire department relies heavily on many different aspects, but none so much as it's volunteers. Without them, the biggest and shiniest fire engine in the world wouldn't matter. Here in Tarpley, our small department has a dedicated group of volunteers who put in countless hours to keep our response capabilities current. Over the past year, we have continued our monthly trainings at the Fire Station as well as traveled to many other trainings hosted by other departments or agencies. These trainings include Motor Vehicle Accidents, Wild Land Fire, Structure Fire, Medical, and Technical Rescue to name a few. Since this time last year, 911 calls in all of these areas of emergency response have been made and responded to by Tarpley Volunteer Fire Department. If you think you might be interested in joining our team, I invite you to reach out to me as we are always on the look out for responders. This past Spring, we finally received much needed rains. These rains have produced lush pastures that have been a sight for sore eyes. With the resurgence of pasture growth, comes an increase in Fire Danger as these fuels dry out over the Summer. If you are considering burning brush piles, trash pits, or even pastures, and are unsure of how to go about doing this, please feel free to contact me. I'm happy to offer any help or advice that I can. I'd like to personally thank those of you who have contributed in any way to our Department in the past. These contributions give us the resources and tools necessary to make a difference in our community and we strive to make good on your generosity. Be safe out there! - Chief Adam Jenschke
