### Secretary's Report:

### **Treasurer's Report:**

- The Treasurer's report was presented by Curtis Kosub.
- Balances: Construction Account \$224,704.49; Operating Account \$84,474.09; Savings Account \$3,257.18; Figures for the CDs from the prior month are \$21,133.85 and \$10,598.41.
- Building continues to be under budget at this time by several thousand dollars as contractors donate goods and services.
- Robert made the motion to approve the Treasurer's report and was seconded by Cody. Motion carried.
- Picnic results
  - We sold 643 plates in 45 minutes bringing in \$8,554.00.
    This includes over \$2,000 in donations at the point of meal ticket purchase.
  - Record silent auction revenue of \$3,810.00.
  - o Best live auction revenue since 2014 of \$10,776.00
  - o Total revenue \$47,932.06. Expenses were \$10,602.17. Total net for the event was a record \$37,329.89.

# • Suggestions

 Four people selling meal tickets. The donations caused confusion, but well worth it.

- Doug recommended we look for a way to account for these donations in a more secure manner without dissuading donations.
- o Advertise on The Ranch radio station.
- Trouble with the line formation. Consider theatre chains or additional signage, tape.
- o People appreciate not having a band. Conversation is easier.
- Discussion about changing the date to a cooler time of year.
  Consensus was to leave it Labor Day weekend.
- Fertilize the grounds when construction is done? Doug will investigate and get quotes.
- Need to buy some trees. Monterey Oak, Mexican White Oak, and Cedar Elm were recommended.
- Need to fill some holes in the ground.
- The toilet seat in the men's restroom is broken.
- In general, the restrooms need TLC. We need to check them more frequently throughout the week, every week, because they are used by the community. Alternative is to install bars and lock the facility. We are going to begin with signage and see what happens.
